

- ➤ Achievement Recognition Highlights for Students and Teachers
 - Barrington High School named National Blue Ribbon School for 2016
 - Nayatt School National Blue Ribbon School for 2015
 - Barrington Middle School National Blue Ribbon for 2014
 - Barrington High School ranked highest on the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA).
 - RI Monthly (Sept 2016) recognizes Barrington High School as top public high school in RI. Factors were low per pupil cost, AP and SAT test scores and course offering.
 - Barrington High School, Middle School Hamden Meadows and Nayatt Elementary Recognized as a 2016 Commended Schools, the Highest Rhode Island Department of Education Classification.
 - US World and News Reports ranked BHS as one of the best High Schools in the country "2016 Gold Medal School"
 - Barrington Public Schools was recognized nationally as one of four 21st Century Learning Exemplar Districts by P21.org.

Known Factors



- ➤ Based on NESDEC's projections it is anticipated that enrollment will increase by 1.4% over the next 5 years.
- Pension Rate
 - Teacher (ERSRI-DB) FY18 rate increase from 13.18% to 13.24%
 - No change to the Define Contribution (DC) Plan
 - Increase cost based on current salaries = \$15,000
- Non-Cert (MERS) FY18 rate will decrease from 9.07% to 8.73%
 - No change to the Define Contribution (DC) Plan
 - Impact on current salaries = (\$13,400)
- ➤ Based on market trends Medical Insurance Rate for FY18 could increase by 5% 8%
